The programmes are open to both male and female applicants with a minimum age of 16 and a maximum age of 45.

Admission Requirements for Courses 1 - 7

Applicants who sat for their MSCE before the introduction of Physics and Chemistry must have a Malawi School Certificate of Education (MSCE) or its equivalent with credit passes in English, Mathematics, Physical Science and Biology. Those who obtained their MSCE after the introduction of Physics and Chemistry, should have credits in English, Biology, Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry. Candidates in both scenarios must have an aggregate of not more than 30 points in their MSCE or its equivalent.

8. Diploma in Nursing (Registered Nursing) - Scholarships: None

Duration: 3 years – Blantyre Campus

Admission Requirements

Applicants who sat for their MSCE before the introduction of Physics and Chemistry must have a Malawi School Certificate of Education (MSCE) or its equivalent with six credits. The credit passes must be in English, Mathematics, Biology, Physical Science and any other two subjects. Those who obtained their MSCE after the introduction of Physics and Chemistry should have credits in English, Biology, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and another credit in any other subject.

9. Diploma in Nursing (Nursing & Midwifery Technician) – Scholarships: None

Duration: 3 years - Zomba Campus

Admission Requirements

Applicants must have a Malawi School Certificate of Education (MSCE) or its equivalent with four credit passes which should include:

- i. English
- ii. Biology
- iii. Physical Science or Chemistry or Physics
- iv. Plus any one science subject (either Mathematics, Agriculture, Geography or Home Economics)

Duration: 2 years

Admission Requirements

Applicants who sat for their MSCE before the introduction of Physics and Chemistry must have a Malawi School Certificate of Education (MSCE) of not more than 36 points or its equivalent with **Credit passes** in English and any of the following subject combinations:

- i. Mathematics and Physical Science (Biology should at least be a pass)
- ii. Mathematics and Biology (Physical Science should at least be a pass)
- iii. Biology and Physical Science (Mathematics should at least be a pass)

Those who obtained their MSCE after the introduction of Physics and Chemistry, should have a Malawi School Certificate of Education (MSCE) of not more than 36 points or its equivalent with **Credit** passes in English and any of the following subject combinations:

- i. Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry (Biology should at least be a pass)
- ii. Mathematics and Biology (Physics and Chemistry should at least be passes)
- iii. Biology, Physics and Chemistry (Mathematics should at least be a pass)
